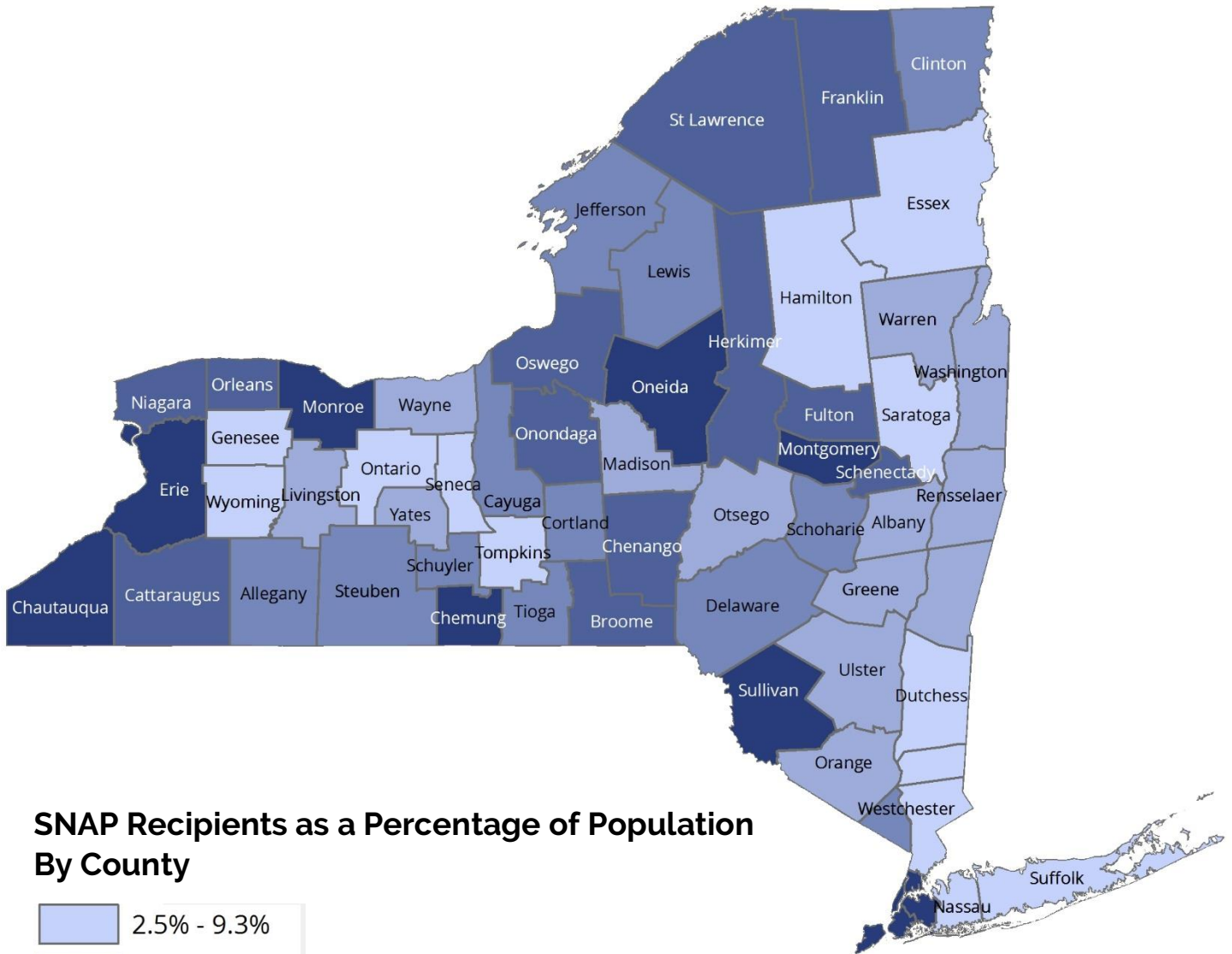




# NYS in a SNAP
