Projected Impacts of COVID-19 on Food Insecurity

In your district:

Food insecurity is projected to increase by 36%.

Child food insecurity is projected to increase by 41%.

This data was compiled prior to the COVID-19 pandemic, and does not reflect its devastating economic impacts. Projections anticipate a significant increase in the number of people facing hunger.

Prior to the pandemic, in your district:

82,800 people faced hunger.

29,720 of them were children.

FFY 2018, Feeding America, published 2019

38,353 families used SNAP to buy food:

69% were **working families.**

43% included **children.**

36% included a **senior.**

50% included a **person with a disability.**

629 retailers accepted SNAP.
