SNAP Fights Hunger in New York

SNAP reduces poverty, improves public health, responds to crisis, and bolsters local economies across NYS.



In New York State:

1.7 million families used SNAP to buy food.

Of the families who participated in SNAP:

29% included children.

42% included a senior.

21% included a **person with a disability.**

78% of eligible people in **working poor** households received SNAP.

\$4.3 billion in SNAP benefits were spent at 16,700+ retailers.

SNAP benefits are spent quickly and locally at **grocers and farmers' markets,** boosting the economy and sustaining jobs.

The average SNAP benefit is \$6.43 per person per day.

That covers **fewer than two meals in NYS**, where the average cost of a meal is \$3.52.
